8B) PERSONAL: How do you think following the commands that we have looked at this week could help you to have hope so that your heart would be softened and you would be willing to submit to God's will?

ACT: Our heart is so vulnerable. We can be easily hurt and a hurting heart will affect the way we act and the things we do. It's vital that we guard our heart and that we ask God to search our heart and reveal places that may be suffering from hardness. We then must trust God and submit to His will. We need to encourage each other because God is in control and we can have great hope because we know that God is working all things together for our good and His Glory.

<u>Daily Devotional:</u> It always helps to look at the context of the passage. Then try to answer the following questions about the passage. Who is involved? What is going on? Where is the action taking place? When? How can this concept apply to my life? Why is it important? Also look for Commands, Warnings, and Examples to follow or not to follow.

· This week let's explore passages that describe how a hardened heart is not what we want for our lives.

Monday:

Exodus 14:17 NIV

I will harden the hearts of the Egyptians so that they will go in after them. And I will gain glory through Pharaoh and all his army, through his chariots and his horsemen.

Tuesday:

Psalm 95:8-10 NIV

"Do not harden your hearts as you did at Meribah, as you did that day at Massah in the wilderness, where your ancestors tested me; they tried me, though they had seen what I did. For forty years I was angry with that generation; I said, 'They are a people whose hearts go astray, and they have not known my ways."

Wednesday:

Matthew 13:15 NLT

For the hearts of these people are hardened, and their ears cannot hear, and they have closed their eyes—so their eyes cannot see, and their ears cannot hear, and their hearts cannot understand, and they cannot turn to me and let me heal them

Thursday:

Romans 9:16-18 NLT

So it is God who decides to show mercy. We can neither choose it nor work for it. For the Scriptures say that God told Pharaoh, "I have appointed you for the very purpose of displaying my power in you and to spread my fame throughout the earth." So you see, God chooses to show mercy to some, and he chooses to harden the hearts of others so they refuse to listen.

Friday:

Romans 11:7 NLT

So this is the situation: Most of the people of Israel have not found the favor of God they are looking for so earnestly. A few have—the ones God has chosen—but the hearts of the rest were hardened.

Saturday:

2 Corinthians 3:14 NLT

But the people's minds were hardened, and to this day whenever the old covenant is being read, the same veil covers their minds so they cannot understand the truth. And this veil can be removed only by believing in Christ.

Sunday:

Ephesians 4:18 NLT

Their minds are full of darkness; they wander far from the life God gives because they have closed their minds and hardened their hearts against him.
